ALL-AMERICAN 2019-2020 UPDATE

First off, on behalf of the Membership Department, I hope that everyone out there is staying safe and taking care of yourself and your family during this stressful time. The ongoing pandemic has impacted much of the VFW's operations, but we're proud to say we are still seeing growth and retention of our membership as we approach the last few months of the membership year.

Many have asked if this will affect programs such as the All-American contest. After discussion with Commander-in-Chief Doc Schmitz, the following changes have been made:

- Post All-American: the requirement to purchase Buddy Poppies has been waived, due to the current inability to fulfill orders from the National Headquarters.
- Department All-American: the requirement to establish one new Post or raise three Posts that began the year under 50 members to above 50 members has been waived, due to the ongoing pandemic making it impossible to hold Post institution proceedings or recruiting events.
- Department All-American: membership percentage quotas have been adjusted to 98%.

No other changes have been made at this time; all other membership and program-related criteria remain the same.

VFW National Convention

VFW Cancels Reno National Convention (The convention was scheduled for July 18-23, 2020.)

The Veterans of Foreign Wars announced on April 20, 2020, its 121st VFW National Convention scheduled to be held in Reno, Nevada, this July was officially cancelled.

The decision comes as public-health concerns and social-distancing mandates are expected to span into the summer months ahead.

Pursuant to the organization’s bylaws, the VFW National Council of Administration is responsible for administering the affairs and transacting the business of the organization in the intervals between conventions to include conducting an election of national officers.

Despite the cancellation of convention, the VFW remains fully operational in accepting and processing applications to all of its national support programs and maintains an active role in advocating for veterans' legislation.

Reno 2020 Housing Reservation Cancellations

As of April 20, 2020, if you made your hotel reservation with Orchid Events/VFW Housing, your reservation has been cancelled automatically and you were sent a notification of the cancellation via email (if an email was provided).

No fees (1st night deposits) have been charged to credit cards. No action is required on your part. If you paid a hotel deposit by check, you will be refunded.

Note: If you made a hotel reservation at a hotel outside of the VFW room blocks - Official VFW Hotels - Grand Sierra, Atlantis or Nugget, you will need to call the hotel you directly made the reservation with and cancel that reservation yourself.

Post/Delegate Registration Fees for the 121st VFW National Convention

On April 17, 2020, the VFW National Council of Administration took action to cancel the 121st VFW National Convention, in its current form, due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The National Council of Administration has adopted directives to carry out the business of the Veterans of Foreign Wars that include a *pro-forma* Convention, and the succession and election of officers for the 2020-21 administrative year.

The collection of Convention Registration Fees, paid by VFW Posts, are an estimated \$190,000.

VFW National Bylaws, Article II, Section 222(d), states each Post will pay, in advance, a National Convention registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25). On May 1, 2020, the VFW National Council of Administration voted to halt the collection of National Convention Registration fees, and take the necessary steps to facilitate refunds to those Posts and delegates who have paid registration and/or delegates fees, for the 121st VFW National Convention.

Department/District Conventions and Election of Officers

Executive Order No. 2 provides a directive for conducting the fraternal business of the organization, including options as to how Departments, Districts, and Posts may conduct elections in keeping with the requirements and customs of the VFW. Please refer to this document, as well as the other guides found on VFW's COVID-19 webpage behind the login.

Note: Departments cancelling their conventions should notify the hotel of the cancellation in writing.

DISPLAYING MILITARY SERVICE SYMBOLS. Military service flags, insignias, etc., should be displayed in the following order (left to right as you face the flags): Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force and then Coast Guard. For military flags, go to vfwstore.org/products/GP238.

50TH ANNIVERSARY VIETNAM WAR COMMEMORATION PROGRAM. The Commemorative Partner Program is designed for federal, state and local communities, veterans' organizations and other non-governmental organizations to assist a grateful nation in thanking and honoring our Vietnam veterans and their families. As a Commemorative Partner, VFW Posts are encouraged to participate in the Commemoration of the Vietnam War by planning and conducting events and activities that will recognize the Vietnam veterans and their families' service, valor, and sacrifice.

Events and activities should be dignified, memorable occasions that show a sensitivity and appreciation for the solemnity of war and the losses suffered by many. Commemorative Partners should communicate how their events will achieve the congressionally-mandated objectives of the program. Events or activities should meet one or more of the following objectives.

1. To thank and honor veterans of the Vietnam War, including personnel who were held as prisoners of war or listed as missing in action, for their service and sacrifice on behalf of the United States and to thank and honor the families of these veterans.
2. To highlight the service of the Armed Forces during the Vietnam War and the contributions of Federal agencies and governmental and non-governmental organizations that served with, or in support of, the Armed Forces.
3. To pay tribute to the contributions made on the home front by the people of the United States during the Vietnam War.
4. To highlight the advances in technology, science, and medicine related to military research conducted during the Vietnam War.
5. To recognize the contributions and sacrifices made by the allies of the United States during the Vietnam War.

For the VFW Posts interested in becoming an official Commemorative Partner, they must submit an application and a signed Statement of Understanding.

Applications are available at VietnamWar50th.com on the Commemorative Partner Program. The approval process is usually less than 30 days. Partners will be kept informed through electronic notifications. Once approved as a Partner, the Commemoration will provide organizations with a starter kit of materials for developing and implementing their programs. The program is a special designation for Posts, patriotic organizations, local chapters of civic organizations, among others, to be recognized as an official "AEF Memorial Corps Post" for making a donation to build the national WWI memorial in Washington, D.C. Your Post will be certified with a special Centennial Certificate commemorating your contribution in "going over the top" to get the memorial built. FLAG DAY, JUNE 14. All VFW units are reminded to properly display the U.S. Flag on Flag Day, Thursday, June 14 and to conduct a ceremony or program as feasible. You may contact the VFW Communications Department for a Flag Day speech. It is also suggested Posts should award the VFW Patriotic Citizen Award (Product No. 4385) for those who have daily displayed our National flag.

POW/MIA FLAG -- OFFICIAL DISPLAY DAYS. Public Law 105-85 (Nov. 16, 1997) indicates the days that federal agencies, military installations and U.S. post offices are required to display the POW/MIA flag. The days are: Armed Forces Day, May 16, 2020 (third Saturday in May); Memorial Day, May 25, 2020 (last Monday in May); Flag Day, June 14; Independence Day, July 4; National POW/MIA Day, Sept. 18, 2020 (third Friday in Sept.); and Veterans Day, Nov. 11. To purchase a POW/MIA flag, go to vfwstore.org/products/GP237.

IRS AND VFW AWARD MONIES. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) requires that any recipient that receives more than a \$599 award should receive a Form 1099 identifying the proceeds as taxable. This will include the VFW programs Patriot's Pen and Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Award.

National Veterans Service

National Veterans Service to host Virtual Training for Service Officers

This spring the VFW was forced to make the difficult choice to cancel the spring service officer training conference in Valley Forge, Pennsylvania. However, the National Veterans Service training team quickly moved to deliver much of this critical training in an online environment to VFW Department Service Officers.

In June, NVS will host its first Virtual Proficiency Training Conference for DSOs over a period of three weeks through proctored video teleconferences which will also be archived for easy access for any DSO who cannot physically log onto each teleconference. Keeping with the format of past service officer training conferences, DSOs will have an opportunity to participate in a directors' forum with NVS leadership. They will also be required to complete a test on the information provided during the virtual conference.

NVS tested this training format with new VFW employees throughout the month of April, with considerable success. A formal announcement of the training schedule and curriculum will be sent to DSOs in early May, allowing ample time to prepare.

National Legislative Service/Action Corps

Veterans Have Until May 5, 2020, to Add Dependents for Stimulus Payment

On April 24, 2020, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) [announced on Twitter](#) that veterans who receive VA Compensation and Pension payments, who do not file taxes, and who have dependents have until May 5, 2020, to add their dependent information to ensure their stimulus payment includes the \$500 per dependent pay. The IRS is urging this group of veterans to use the [Non-Filer tool](#) on the IRS website to update their dependent information. If a veteran in this group has had the \$1,200 stimulus payment issued, they will no longer be eligible to use the Non-Filer tool. Their payment will be \$1,200 and, by law, the additional \$500 per eligible child amount would be paid in association with a return filing for tax year 2020.

VFW Posts Eligible for COVID-19 Small Business Assistance

SBA is running the [Paycheck Protection Program](#), which consists of an SBA loan that helps businesses keep their workforce employed during the COVID-19 crisis. Administrative Operations

Post Election Reports must be submitted no later than June 1 to the National Headquarters. We encourage all Post Quartermasters to use the online Election Report process featured in the Online Membership System (OMS), which is located behind the member's "LOGIN" at vfw.org.

The 2020-2021 Department Roster is now an Online Membership System (OMS) submitted report. The interactive report will cover reporting of all Department elected and appointed officers and committee chairman. In addition, the District Election Report is also contained within the Online Membership System (OMS). Portions of the District report will feed into the Department report (i.e. the District Commander position).

Adjutants and Quartermasters can access the roster by logging into their OMS account under the “Election Report” drop down in the left hand navigation pane. Membership numbers of each elected/appointed officer and/or chairman is needed to complete the report. Your cooperation in completing the roster immediately following your convention is appreciated. Any additions, corrections or changes will be submitted through OMS as they occur throughout the year.
