

Department Officer's Comments & Department Committee Reports

From the Commander:

Comrades,

This month's letter will focus primarily on Membership! Memstats numbers are now posted as of 5 September 2018. I am so proud of all of you. We are ranked #2 in the VFW National organization in membership. We have 7 Posts and 2 Districts that are now at 100% or greater. My congratulations go out to Post 9723 (Okinawa), Post 9555 (Yokota), Post 9957 (Taipei), Post 12146 (Ban Chang), Post 124 (Baguio), Post 9892 (La Union), and Post 11447 (Subic Bay).



The DPA had 272 Life Members reactivated in September. The CinC and the VFW National Membership Team spent several months reviewing more than 68,000+ Life Members who were placed in a category called "Inactive" over the past several years. The previous standard used by VFW National was to place anyone age 75 or older with an "undeliverable" address into this category. Many posts complained this was arbitrary and that they had members who were still alive and listed as "inactive". The membership team used various tools to scrub the numbers. National was able to reduce this group to 9,984. These members were reactivated and Life Member payouts were made to the Posts, Districts and Departments in early September. The DPA Adjutant sent an email with an Excel Spreadsheet and the CinC's Team Alert to all District Commanders, Post Commanders/Adjutants & Quartermasters with a complete list of these reactivated Life Members. The CinC's Team Alert is on our Face Book Page and clearly states the rationale on the reactivations. Chief BJ has asked that Post Quartermasters do their best to validate these member's information and status. These members will remain on the Post Membership Rolls until they can be properly validated. If your Quartermasters know that a member is deceased - report them to National via the Online Membership System (OMS). The National Council of Administration unanimously supported the CinC's decision to give the Posts the benefit of the doubt before the VFW removes a Life Member from the Membership Rolls in the future. Please take the time to read CinC BJ's Alert. If your Post benefited by the reactivations – that is good because you should have been receiving credit for these Life Members all along. I now ask you to take the next step and follow-up where you can to help National keep their membership records accurate. Lastly - if this effort by the CinC helped you achieve 100% or greater - then help him and the entire Membership Team by continuing your recruiting efforts. It has been many years since National has "Gone Over The Top"! Let's all help BJ "Make It Happen"!

We have many programs to work! Please keep working them and let's "GET IT DONE".


From the Senior Vice Commander:

Well, MEMSTATS finally came up, and with the addition of the reinstated members, we are looking very good. On top of the 166 new members, we picked up a couple of hundred more. Japan seems to have made out the best, but all Districts improved considerably. We have seven posts greater than 100% already, with two more poised to join them. It appears we will have a lot of Posts eligible for the Early Bird stipend.

Don't forget to bring up the discounts available for lifetime membership conversion. That \$100 can make all the difference. Hopefully your Post is using the stipend to discount the newly

recruited lifetime members. Another huge bonus for them. And please, when you have a membership drive, take a photo or two, and place it on the All-Around the Pacific Facebook page. It's great to see recruiting away from the canteen environment. Exchanges, events, etc. are good for the VFW.



A recent development, mentioned above, is the reinstatement of many of our elderly members. The formula and method National had been using was very inefficient, as many of those placed as inactive were, in fact, still alive and active. So, they have instituted a new system which will hopefully be more realistic. All told, 272 lifetime members will be reappearing on their Posts rosters, in time for the Lifetime Payouts. Thank you, BJ!

The Department of Pacific will have a banner year. Let's GET IT DONE!

National Direct Dues Program

Our Department will participate in the National Direct Dues Program. This means the entire transmittal, along with the dues is sent directly to National for both annual and life memberships. The Posts will be paid their portion of the Life Membership and Annual dues from National. Contact the Department Quartermaster or Department Senior Vice Commander for assistance.

VFW Online Dues Processing

Post Quartermasters are highly encouraged to submit their dues processing using the VFW Online Membership Systems.

New post Institution Program Refund

Any new Post instituted during the year will receive a rebate of \$6.00 from Department for each new and reinstated member listed on the final Charter Application form submitted to National. When the new Post is officially instituted and chartered – the Department Quartermaster will refund monies for those members shown on the Charter on the closing date (up to 90 days after the institution of the Post). The Life Membership stipend does not apply to the formation of a new Post.



Life Membership

Life membership recruiting is an important program and we will strive to encourage everyone to become a Life Member. We have to be sure that all new and potential life members understand how strongly the VFW supports them, other veterans and local communities. It goes without saying that without the recruiting of new members, our great organization will not be able to survive. Recruiting must begin at the Post level. It is up to each Comrade to do their part to ensure that our organization continues to grow. We have a proud legacy of leading the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States of America in membership recruitment throughout the years. Let's go out and show them that the best Department is right here in the Pacific Areas.



From the Quartermaster:

Comrades,

You may or may not have heard about the minor change to the subscription dues program. Previously, an annual member's dues were subject for renewal on the one year anniversary of his dues processing date. So if an annual member paid his dues on July 15, 2017, he was considered delinquent on July 16, 2018. The problem, according to National, was that 365 different days had to be tracked for dues renewal notices, expirations, etc. So what they have done is to extend all annual members' expiration date to the last day of the month in which their membership expired.



This makes sense and it is now much easier for National – and Posts – to track the number of members who are due for renewal each month. If you send out 30-60-90 day reminders to annual members, it now only has to be done once a month.

Speaking of annual members, the Department has a new program this year to encourage annual members to become Life members. For each 5 annual members in one Post who convert to Life, the Department will award that Post a \$250 stipend to help offset any discount the Post might want to give members who convert from annual to Life. We've already had one Post, 11447, which has taken advantage of this program. Post leadership can think of ways to make this work for them.

Quartermaster bonds for 2018-2019 have been sent to each Post and District QM. Only one District has yet to pay for the new bond. And I'm happy to report that every Post has ordered Buddy Poppies for this year. Well done! The poppies should be arriving soon as they were mailed from National in mid-August. Posts in Districts V and VII may have to wait a month or more for delivery because the donkeys that deliver mail in these associated countries need to stop and be fed. (Just a little humor; don't get upset.)

Life member payments from National are due out this month. Traditionally they arrive around the third week of the month. Equally as important, we will finally be able to see accurate MEMSTATS numbers so we'll know what it takes to make 100% this year. Recruiting has been a bit slower in the first two months of this year than in previous years. So it's time to pick it up and "make it happen".

"John McCain was a patriot who cared deeply about the health and well-being of those who have worn the uniform of our country and their families," said Lawrence, "and on behalf of the entire VFW family, I send our deepest condolences to his family for their loss, and thank them for their strength and support that enabled him to continue serving our great nation for so many years.

From the Surgeon:

Is Manhood Killing You?

We have been molded by decades of 'Big boys don't cry', 'No pain-no gain', 'Mission first', 'Suck it up' & 'Push through the pain'.

We are primitive in the way we approach our health. Like animals defending our territory, we are afraid to show any sign of weakness. So for us, admitting that we need help is the same as admitting defeat.

Being a 'real man' is probably the biggest barrier between a man and his doctor. You can see this macho attitude at the forefront when a Comrade brags about not going to the doctor in years. Or when he ignores physical symptoms and carries on just like any other day. I have personally seen too many examples of the tendency for veterans to ignore symptoms and 'soldier on' regardless. I have also seen this inaction or delay result in what may well have been preventable surgeries & amputations- and even premature death.

Two related studies by Rutgers University School of Arts and Sciences researchers point out that the inherent beliefs of men on masculinity may compel them to ignore symptoms and/or delay preventative care and treatment until it is too late. Also, the usual suspects of denial, fear, apathy or simply 'being too busy' can also prevent some from taking action.

The reality is that the stereotypical macho male image of strength and invulnerability does us no favors at all; in fact it works against us by hindering our inclination towards health seeking behavior. To take charge of our own health, we need to break free of some of the personal and societal beliefs that have been instilled in us since childhood. We also need to make our personal health and wellbeing our mission-and conduct it just like we would any other mission.

All Patriot's Pen essays and Voice of Democracy audio essays should be reviewed by the chairman several days before the judging, so that small errors like too many words, and audio CD or USB drive that will not play on your equipment, a Voice of Democracy audio essay that is a bit too long/short, or a reference that inadvertently identifies them might be corrected by the student rather than the chairman eliminating them from the competition. Chairman should never forget that our priority is to increase the number of students participating, rather than eliminating them.

- * Entry deadline to the Post is 31 October 2018. In order to qualify for All-State and All-American, each Post and District must submit entries for all three programs or make a donation to VFW National. From the Legislative Committee Chairman:


Comrades,

Just a reminder, it is never too early to think about your post's All-State requirements, and one of our requirements for All-State and All-American is as follows:

Post participation in one or more of the following activities:

1. Support an ongoing "VFW Action Corps Weekly" registration drive reporting to the Department National Legislative Chairman.

OR



OR

3. Adopt a Unit, reporting to the Department Veterans & Military Support Chairman. to either

If it is difficult for your post to hold a Welcome Home Event or Adopt a Unit, then holding a VFW Action Corps Weekly is a simple and relatively easy task to accomplish. Once you complete the drive, please email me at the below email address. Holding the drive is not merely a checkmark, though. The weekly is the best way that we, as VFW members, can keep track of legislative action that matters to the VFW and all vets. So even if your post has completed either of the second two requirements, I urge all posts to still hold their registration drive.

Here are some of the current legislative highlights concerning vets:

- 1. Army to Screen 40,000 Homes for Lead: Following a Reuters report last week that found children living in Army housing faced a substantial risk of lead exposure, the Army announced this week that it will be conducting a review of approximately 40,000 on-post residences. The report highlighted medical findings showing that 31 children living in communities at Ft. Benning, Ga., suffered lead poisoning after being exposed to lead-based paint. The report also stated that in addition to homes at Ft. Benning, homes at Ft. Polk, Ft. Hood, Ft. Knox, Ft. Riley, and the United States Military Academy also tested dangerously high for lead. Additionally, between 2011 and 2016, more than 1,000 children living on post tested above the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's lead threshold level. At a press conference on Tuesday, Secretary of Defense James Mattis stated, "...this is a moral obligation we have to the families to provide safe lodging, obviously, for them. And it's something we take very, very seriously." Read the report.
- 2. Report Finds Veterans Improperly Denied MST-related PTSD Claims: VA's Office of Inspector General (OIG) released a report that investigated denied disability claims for posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD) related to military sexual trauma (MST). The findings concluded that the Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA) processed approximately 12,000 claims annually over the past three years for PTSD related to MST. In FY2017, VBA denied about 5,500 of those claims. The OIG review team sampled 169 denied claims and discovered 82 were incorrectly processed, which indicates an overall adjudication error rate of 49 percent. The incorrectly processed denial error projections were mostly found to be due to evidence submitted, VA not requesting adequate evidence, veterans submitting claims not being contacted by VA's MST coordinators, and insufficient medical opinions. "The Inspector General's report is very troubling," said VFW National Commander B.J. Lawrence in a press statement. "The VA's own statistics show that suicide rates among military sexual assault victims are a growing problem, yet here we have VBA which is the key to all things VA incorrectly processing almost a quarter of all claims. That's failing our veterans." Veterans who submitted claims for PTSD related to MST and feel their claims were improperly denied may contact the VFW for claims assistance. Read the report.
- 3. VFW Participates in Secretary of the Navy Retiree Council Meeting: On Monday, August 20, VFW Director of National Security and Foreign Affairs John Towles joined the members of the Secretary of the Navy's Retiree Council for a question and answer session at the Washington Navy Yard. Points of discussion focused on the VFW's advocacy efforts on Capitol Hill and provided members with the opportunity to get updates on legislation concerning toxic exposure, the Survivor Benefit Plan and Dependency and Indemnity Compensation, and transition services for members who are pending retirement. The council, which meets annually, is one element of the Department of the Navy Retired Activities Program and is composed of retired Navy and Marine Corps



officers and enlisted personnel. It was established to address issues of significant importance to retired military personnel and their family members, and to facilitate interaction

The 1947 National Security Act restructured The United States military and intelligence agencies in the aftermath of World War II. On September 18, 1947, President Truman signed the National Security Act establishing the U.S. Airforce on board the first Air Force One, a VC 54C.

Gold Star Mother's Day 29 September, 2018 - Gold Star Mother's Day is observed in the United States on the last Sunday of September each year. It is a day for people to recognize and honor those who have lost a son or daughter while serving the United States Armed Forces.

The Veterans of Foreign Wars was established on 29 September, 1899 in Columbus Ohio. It took a small group of Spanish-American War veterans to band together to create one voice on behalf of all American veterans.

On 25 August, 2018, the United States lost a great American. John S. McCain, was a naval pilot that was held as a prisoner of war in Vietnam and rose to the positions as a congressman and a senator. He is a true example of a hero and will be missed. Thank you for your service. Rest in peace.
