We have a number of resources that can be used to assist you in recruiting new members.

#### Among them are the following:

- National Recruiter PDC Larry Lyons (pdclyons@vfwdeptpacific.org) is an excellent resource and an expert in planning and funding recruiting events.
- Life Memberships are what sustains our Department. Cliff Wilsey (clffwilsey@gmail.com) is our resident expert on incentives and processing Life memberships.
- Legacy Life Chairman Bob Zaher (bobzaher@gmail.com) will assist with incentives and information to upgrade your members from Life to Legacy.
- The VFW National website has a wide range of videos and other support materials available at the Membership Recruiting and Retention web link.

Below are the various incentive programs the Department is offering this year.

(NOTE: N/R = New or Recovered (Reinstated) Member

#### Early Bird Program (Ends November 30, 2019) Post and District Awards:

- Posts at 100% plus 10 members will win one Life Membership or 1 Bronze Legacy Life Membership or a \$400 Stipend for its Post Membership Program.
- Districts with all posts over 100% membership will win one free Life Membership or a \$400 Stipend to use for membership recruiting.

#### Individual Recruiter Awards

- 3-5 members Commander's Pin & DPA Pin
- 10 members \$25.00 gift certificate
- 25 members \$50.00 gift certificate
- 50 members \$75.00 gift certificate
- 100 members \$100.00 gift certificate

#### Life Member Recruiting Program (Posts)

- Posts at 500 and over members: For every 10 N/R Life Members recruited 1 \$400 Stipend or 1 DPA paid Life Membership to be used for their membership program.
- Posts under 500 members: For every 5 N/R Life Members recruited 1 \$400 Stipend or 1 DPA paid Life Membership to be used for their membership program.

#### Legacy Life Membership Program

- Posts over 1,000 members: Recruit 5 New Gold Legacy Life Members Get 1 DPA Paid Bronze Legacy Life Membership or 1 DPA Paid Legacy Life Upgrade.
- Posts 500-999: Recruit 4 New Gold Legacy Life Members Get 1 DPA Paid Bronze Legacy Life Membership or 1 DPA Paid Legacy Life Upgrade.



 Posts under 500 members: Recruit 3 New Gold Legacy Life Members – Get 1 DPA Paid Bronze Legacy Life Membership or 1 DPA Legacy Life Upgrade.

Annual Member to Life Member Conversion Program (For the year ending 30 June 2020)

- DPA will partner with Posts to provide a matching \$50 stipend to promote their Annual Member to Life Membership Conversion Program with a \$100 combined Stipend.
- Posts who achieve 5 Annual Member to Life Member Conversions will be provided a \$250 Stipend.

Please remember it is up to the Post QMs to request the various stipends and provide the names of each of the new or converted members to the DPA QM and to advise the DPA CDR and DPA SVC that you have achieved any of the above award requirements.

As many of you know membership numbers are a little difficult to track this early in the year as the National Membership Team does a reset of the Online Membership System for the new term.

One final point regarding membership, at this point MEMSTATS numbers will be lower than you expect since they track only renewals starting on 1 July 2019. VFW National has informed us that the first Life Membership totals will be posted in MEMSTATS once the first Life Membership Payouts have been made to the Department, Districts, and Posts in September 2019.

Don't want you to think membership is all we are interested in, to date we have provided grants of \$1000 to needy veterans within our Department. The Veterans Assistance Committee is standing by to assist, within our parameters, veterans who find themselves with a financial emergency such as unexpected medical bills.

Oh yes, you may see postings on Facebook from SVC DPA, that account belongs to yours truly.

## From the Quartermaster:

Comrades.

Quartermaster Bonds for 2019-2020 were sent to each Post and District Quartermaster's DEPARTMENT email address. Post and District Commanders also received notice that the bonds have been sent. Buddy Poppies will also be ordered this month and will be shipped by National to the Post Quartermaster's mailing address. Therefore, if your Post has not sent the 2019-2020 General Order #1 to the Department Adjutant, your Poppies will not be ordered until I know where to tell National to send them.



National has yet to include the Life Members in your MEMSTATS numbers, but your year-end number from last year is listed, so you know how many members you'll need to reach 100%. This year's all American program will pick only the top 25 Posts in each Division for All-American, but our All-State program has not changed. I believe that the All-American program needs significant change if it is going to be an effective recruiting incentive.

In September, National makes the Life Member payout to each Post and Department. The payout is based on when each member became a Life member. Those joining more recently have the highest payout because they paid more to become a Life member than those who became Life years ago. Nevertheless, payouts range from roughly \$8 per newer member to \$5 for the older ones, with a few other categories in between. If you figure \$6.50 for each Life member, you'll have a pretty good idea what your Post payout will be.

Summer is fading fast so it's time to think about getting to the business of the VFW – recruiting, VOD/Patriot's Pen/Teacher awards. Poppy sales, the annual donations to the National Home and Veterans and Military Support which have increased to \$75 this year, and helping military members and their families as well as veterans in our community. Remember that the VFW Foundation has grants of \$1,000 that Posts (and Auxiliaries) can use to donate to a local charity. The earlier you apply for this grant, the more likely you will receive it.




#### From the Mid-Term C of A Chairman:



# From the Surgeon:

#### **Oral Health affects Overall Health**

You probably know that taking good care of your teeth and gums gives you fresh breath & prevents tooth decay. But did you know that oral health problems can also affect your overall health and wellbeing?

**Cardiovascular Disease:** Poor oral health allows bacteria to get into the bloodstream causing the arteries to build up plaque and harden. This leads to blood flow problems & heart blockages and it increases the likelihood of having a heart attack or stroke.



**Dementia:** Substances that are released from gums inflamed by infection can actually kill brain cells and lead to memory loss. Dementia and possibly even Alzheimer's disease can result from gingivitis when the bacteria in the mouth spreads to the nerve channels or enters the bloodstream.

**Respiratory Infection:** Bacteria in the mouth from infected teeth and swollen gums can be breathed into the lungs or travel there through the bloodstream. Once there the bacteria can lead to respiratory infections, pneumonia and acute bronchitis.

**Diabetes:** Not only are diabetics already more susceptible to infection such as infected gums that lead to periodontal disease, but periodontal disease can in turn make diabetes more difficult to control. Symptoms can worsen as blood sugar levels go haywire because of gum disease. It is especially important for diabetics to take good care of their oral health to prevent complications with their disease. Because gum disease can lead to higher than normal blood sugar levels, a person with poor oral health is at an increased risk of developing diabetes.

**Erectile Dysfunction:** Bacteria from diseased gums can get into the bloodstream and cause blood vessels to become inflamed. This inflammation can block the flow of blood to the genitals, making erections more difficult or even impossible to achieve.

**Cancer:** Risk for kidney cancer, pancreatic cancer, and blood cancers is much higher for people who have poor oral health.

**Kidney Disease:** People with gum disease generally have weaker immune systems and are more likely to acquire infections. Many people who suffer from very poor oral health also suffer from kidney disease.

**Rheumatoid Arthritis:** According to the National Rheumatoid Arthritis Society, people with gum disease were four times more likely to have Rheumatoid Arthritis. Both diseases have inflammation in common. The oral bacteria from gingivitis can increase inflammation throughout the body. This makes the risk for developing rheumatoid arthritis much higher.

So, see your dentist regularly. Brush. Do it often. And floss, too. Your mouth – and health – will thank you.

### From the Women's Veterans Chair:

After World War II there were many changes in the US that effected the military as a whole. The war was over, all the branches were downsizing, and there was an expectation that women would follow the social norms of stereotypical jobs or raising families. President Harry Truman issued Executive order 9981 mandating racial desegregation of the armed forces. Advantages of a smaller population, and women being trained separately from men allowed integration at basic and advanced training sites to be accomplished in all branches by 1950. It took about 6 years for all the branches in all locations worldwide to be fully integrated.

With the order into Korea on 27 June 1950, all the armed forces struggled to recruit and retain personnel. Women were often released from duty as a result of pregnancy, or marriage.



Volunteers with children less than 18 years old were turned away. Reservists were involuntarily called upon to fill the gaps for the first time in history. 120,000 women served on active duty during the Korean War of which a third served in health care: onboard hospital ships, MEDEVAC aircraft, and hospitals receiving the wounded in Japan, Hawaii and stateside. There was a general social ideal that women should not be in harm's way which restricted how and where they could serve. The Mobile Army Surgical Hospitals (MASH) were often close to the ever changing front line and the only combat duty allowed to women. Non-medical jobs were often detail-oriented, administrative, typing and high speed communications. The popular opinion was: women had more patience for boring jobs and were less likely to become complacent. An additional benefit was freeing up leadership and administrative roles in non-combat areas for men to serve in combat duty. SSgt. Hazel A. Lindahl, a reservist from Boston, was Camp Sergeant Major of more than 40,000 Marines at Camp Lejeune. This is a post typically held by an E-9.

An example of volunteerism and exemplary service can be seen in Utah where 5 sisters have each gone their own path serving in the Army, Airforce, and Navy. Capt. She joined the Utah National Guard prior to 9/11 and switched to the Air force Reserves after a 2003 Iraq deployment. Maj. Tayva Lamb is a Cyberspace Operations Officer, Utah Air National Guard, 130th Engineering Installation Squadron, and uses her mechanical engineering degree working on the General Dynamics F-16 Fighting Falcon at Hill Air Force Base. SSgt. Ty' lene Puro is an admin assistant in the Utah Army National Guard, 65th Field Artillery Brigade, currently on her way home from a deployment in the Middle East. LTJG Taryn Puro is a Naval Flight Officer, Fleet Readiness Squadron stationed at Naval Air Station Jacksonville, Florida. She flies in the Boeing P-8 Poseidon. The sisters' father is proud of their service "My girls have grown in the military. As a dad, I know they are going to be OK because they have learned to stand on their own two feet and take charge of their lives."

# From the Safety Chairman:

Comrades,

Typhoon season lasts from June to November, and with it brings the need for proper preparation in the event of this Natural Disaster. They can form quickly or they can change direction and surprise us. Depending upon the severity of the typhoon it can affect the infrastructure of the house, including the electricity and water.

An Emergency Preparedness kit should be ready just in case. Which includes the following:

Water, food and first aid supplies. A kit should have a three-day supply of water, which is one gallon per person per day. Food should be a three-day supply of nonperishable and easy to prepare. The first aid supplies should include the normal band aids, disinfectants, gauze, but also any medications that are needed or prescribed. The other items that would be useful to have are flashlights, batteries, a radio, important documents, extra clothes, and something to occupy time like a book or a game.

And when the Typhoon hits, the first thing you should do is stock up on water, food and other items you would need. The second thing is to clean up the yard and put away all the items that can be picked up by strong winds and thrown around. These items cause the most damage every year. Here are some tips for water storage and usages during a typhoon:

Before a typhoon gets too close, fill up your bath tub with water. Typhoons can contaminate the water so it is better to have already clean water stored. This isn't for drinking but for flushing the toilet, cleaning utensils and hygiene care.

Here are some ideas to help keep children calm or distracted during a typhoon, just talking to a child and explaining the situation helps keep a child calm. If a parent is calm about the event, the child is more than likely going to follow their example. Have their favorite nonelectric games, puzzles and books are good things to have on hand to occupy their time during the typhoon too.

In addition, just take a moment and think about what you would do if there wasn't any electricity or water. What would you need? Do you have a radio that uses batteries or do you have a way to charge your phone in the event you need to use it? Do you have everything for the children and pets? Sit down and make a list of everything you think you would need. And do this before a typhoon is imminent. You think clearer when calm and are less likely to forget things. Final reminder, is to keep calm, be informed!

#### Air Force Day

Did you know that there is an official Air Force Day? This is not to be confused with the Air Force Birthday which is celebrated on September 18<sup>th</sup> each year.

Air Force Day is a celebration of air power in the aftermath of World War II. This observance is slightly complicated due to the nature of American air power at the time, but the designation of Air Force Day was an important step toward the recognition of United States air superiority in both Europe and Asia. Air Force Day was last observed on August 1, 1949.



It brought the Department of Defense closer to establishing what we now know as the United States Air Force.

#### **Department of Defense (DoD)**

The U.S. Department of Defense was established August 10th, 1949. Thanks to an amended National Security Act the agency is run by the Secretary of Defense (SECDEF) with the Joint Chiefs of Staff for the various military services operating subordinately to the SECDEF.

As with many such observances, the DoD birthday is not a national holiday, there are no days off, and many of the activities dedicated to celebrating this milestone are done at the organizational level. The DOD birthday events held at military bases or federal government buildings, such as the Pentagon, may include cake cutting ceremonies, dining-outs, media campaigns and social media hashtag events.

The "Best" way to help observe the DoD birthday is to thank a service member or veteran for answering the call of duty! Also, we can contribute our time or funds to support organizations for federal employees and military members.

The DoD birthday will be celebrated on August 10<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

#### **Purple Heart Day**

Let us not forget that August 7<sup>th</sup>, 1782, is the date that commemorates the creation of the Purple Heart Medal. George Washington, Commander in Chief of the Continental Army, created the Purple Heart Medal. It was first known as the Badge of Military Merit and was awarded to 3 Revolutionary Soldiers in 1783.

It was not until February 22, 1932, that the awarding of the Purple was revived. It was to be awarded to those wounded or killed while serving in the United States Armed Forces as a result of enemy action on or after April 5, 1917.

Comrades, do a little research and identify some of the significant non-national holidays. Show your loyalty by observing such a day at your Post meeting or at your Post Canteen.
