

Post Name: VFW Post 8180 is named in honor of Medal of Honor recipient Colonel Lewis L. Millett and the famous Korean War Battle of Bayonet Hill, where then Captain Millett earned his MOH. The Post was initially named "Hill 180 Memorial Post," and the charter was changed in 2010 following Colonel Millett's death to "Colonel Lewis L. Millett Hill 180 Memorial Post", thus maintaining the heritage of our original name while honoring the colonel.

Chartered: April 12, 1970

Post Consolidation:

Sep 11, 2017, Bonifas – Barrett Memorial Post 8180 (Yongsan, Seoul) consolidated with Post 10216 bringing over its number making us Colonel Lewis L. Millett Hill 180 Memorial Post 8180. Post 8180 was named for Maj Arthur G. Bonifas and 1st Lt Mark T. Barrett. These two soldiers were brutally massacred in the August 1976 tree-trimming detail in the DMZ by ax and pike-wielding North Korean troops (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=hte5erv_vCE). Post 8180 had absorbed Perimeter Memorial Post 10086 (Taegu) in April 1997 and Pusan Memorial Post 8830 (Pusan) in January 1998 during previous consolidations.

It is noted the consolidated Post is to be known as Colonel Lewis L. Millett Hill 180 Memorial Post No. 3180, Songtan-Si, Korea. The senior muster date is April 12, 1970.

Announcement of the consolidation will appear in General Orders No. 3, 2017-2013 scrips.

The beginning of our Post:

The following is a historical record from the first 10216 post commander, Earle L. Dowd. Department of Pacific Areas Aid-de-Camp Neil Tremblay was TDY to Osan AB from the 555th TFS out of Naha AB, Japan in 1970. Earle Dowd was assigned to Det 9, 47th Aerospace Rescue and Recovery Service (ARRS) (PEDRO) at Osan AB. Neil started informal discussions with the possibility of forming a post, which had twice before failed. It began with approximately six names, no monies from Dept. they were assigned a charter membership and temporary positions of post-formation to organize. A meeting was held with the Osan Air Base Commander, the Airman, NCO, & Officers Club managers to grant permission to operate the proposed VFW on military grounds. The charter said that they would not attempt to open a VFW Canteen for profit on base and try to compete with club operations. The clubs furnished meeting space without charge.

Jim Price supplied transportation for several trips to the Seoul VFW Post at no cost to attend meetings to form the post. A Post number was suggested as Post 180 but numbers cannot be picked and are assigned by VFW National. A name had to be chosen, Osan AB, Task Force Smith, Hill 180, or Memorial Post Hill 180 were the contenders. To get the word out an no league bowling team was formed with jerseys to advertise the Post. It worked well being that anyone assigned to Korea was authorized the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal which qualified them for membership. We hosted meetings with Seoul to also help Camp Humphreys create a post. Finally, our charter was established. The original leadership of our new post was:



Paper flower sale nets \$650

OSAN AB — Disabled veterans m Veterans Administration hospitals and nursing homes in the U.S. will benefit from \$650 collected by Air Force and Army members of Hill 180 Memorial Post No. 10216. Veterans of Foreign Wars last weekend.

In a two-day drive that saw the VFW men selling red paper flowers, known as "Buddy Poppies," personnel of Osan and Suwon ABs, as well as Camp Humphries made the donations which added up to the \$650.

"We sold 2,000 of the poppies," said MSgt. Frank B. George, post commander, "and we could have sold iwice that many if we'd ordered them. The support we received in the drive was wonderful."

"It looked for a while like everyone on Osan 'airplane patch' had one of our little red flowers," said SSgt. Fritz Barber, chairman of the drive, "and I know for a fact that several people bought as many as three."

The buddy popples are made by the disabled vets and the money that is earned in the drive goes to help them. A percentage of the money is held in the local post relief fund to help veterans with problems they can't handle alone — a death in the family, sickness, house fire, or whatever.

"The success of the drive depended on a lot of people," said Sergeant George, "we owe our thanks to Colonel Behan at Osan and Colonel Yentz at Suwon and Sergeant Major George at Camp Humphries for authorizing it on base, and a special thank you to everyone who purchased a poppy."

Osan honors leader of bayonet charge

OSAN AIR BASE, South Korea — In February 1951, then-Army Capt. Lewis L. Millett led what military historians say was the only organized U.S. bayonet charge since the Civil War.

Millett was awarded the Medal of Honor for his exploits.

On Friday, about 500 U.S. and South Korean soldiers, airmen and family members gathered at this base to honor Millett, who retired a colonel.

Millett, 82, journeyed to Osan from his California home for the ceremony.

The 51st Fight Wing sponsored the ceremony, and the Army's 3rd Battlefield Coordination Detachment at Osan and Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 10216 hosted it.

Millett, from Mechanic Falls, Maine, served in three wars. He received the Silver Star, Bronze Star, Purple Heart and a battlefield commission while serving in Europe during World War II.

At the outbreak of the Korean War, he came to Korea with the 27th Infantry Regiment in Japan as part of the 25th Infantry Division. When the 27th's E Company commander was killed, Millett volunteered for the job.

During Friday's ceremony, Maj. Barry Graham of the Battlefield Coordination Detachment detailed Millett's action at Hill 180.

On Feb. 5, 1951, he said, E Company was fired on by Chinese troops at a hill near what today is Osan Air Base. Its 1st Platoon immediately was pinned down. Millett ordered two platoons to fix bayonets and charge, routing the Chinese soldiers from their foxholes and sending them scurrying down the hill's reverse slope.

"That night, the regimental commander began the paperwork that would bring Millett the Distinguished Service Cross," Graham said. "But little did he know that charge had been only a rehearsal for what would come just 48 hours later."

On Feb. 7, 1951, Millet and two platoons were moving with two tanks toward a 600-foot knoll hill known only as "Hill 180." The name came from its height in meters.

Chinese troops who occupied the hill's crest opened fire. Millett leaped onto a tank and began returning fire with its .50-caliber machine gun. The gun jammed. Millet raced through heavy fire to his 1st Platoon, ordering the troops again to "Fix bayonets! We're going up that hill!"

Millett led the charge, Graham said, "so far in front of his men that he had to dodge grenades thrown by both sides. Although seriously wounded in the back and legs by grenade fragments, he continued to urge his men onward and upward shouting, 'Kill 'ern with the

bayonet!' Jumping into a trench near the crest of the hill, he killed three Chinese soldiers with his own bayonet," Graham said.

When the fight ended, E Company had taken the hill and nearly 100 enemy soldiers lay dead, at least 30 killed with bayonets. Only nine U.S. soldiers were killed.

Millett spent several months recovering from his wounds and received the Medal of Honor from President Truman in a White House ceremony on July 5, 1951.

Millett also served in Vietnam with the 101st Airborne Division and helped establish the Vietnamese Ranger School and a commando training program in Laos before retiring from the Army in 1973.

Retired Army Col. Robert L. Howard, who received the Medal of Honor for action as a Green Beret in Vietnam, was guest speaker at Friday's event. He said many Americans "can remember only two things about the Korean War."

"First of all, a very famous general (Douglas MacArthur) was fired by the president because he couldn't follow orders. The second thing is that it was the first war we lost.

"Americans are impatient," he said. "We expect instant victory. Lewis Millett was impatient when he charged up this hill. There's no doubt in my mind that this air base is here today in part because of his impatience and his service to our country."

Howard, who said he and Millett have been friends for years, recalled an incident in which Millett exhibited his patriotism in Washington, D.C.

"In 1973, when we attended President Nixon's second inauguration, we pulled up in front of the White House on a bus that was immediately attacked by a bunch of anti-war protesters," he said, "Col. Millett told me, 'We're not going to tolerate this.'

"He jumped off the bus and grabbed one protester and destroyed his sign. He shamed about 500 protesters into throwing down their signs and walking away. There were 101st Airborne soldiers protecting the White House and there's no doubt in my mind that if [Millett] had yelled, 'Charge!,' those soldiers would have cleaned all the protesters out of Washington, D.C."

Friday's ceremony ended with a wreath-laying at the Hill 180 monument, a flyover by eight AH-64 Apache helicopters from Camp Humphreys, a rifle salute and taps.

There is a dedication wall to the Tuskegee Airmen in honor of our own Tuskegee Airmen MSgt (Ret) James" Jim" Price who unfortunately passed away on 20 July 2008. Jim had been with our Post since its beginning.

Post Activities:

- The post also teams up with the Osan AB USO throughout the year to provide a free lunch for the base populace, as well as travel to Kunsan AB, which does not have a USO, to do the same.

- Conducts monthly visits to patients at area hospitals to include the Osan AB Hospital
- There are Buddy Poppy drives throughout the year to support veterans.
 - Among all the flowers that evoke the memories and emotions of war is the red poppy, which became associated with war after the publication of a poem written by Col. John McCrae of Canada. The poem, "In Flander's Field" describes blowing red fields among the battleground of the fallen. The VFW was the first veterans' organization to adopt the poppy and develop a national distribution campaign. For more than 75 years, the VFW's Buddy Poppy program has raised millions of dollars in support of veterans' welfare and the well-being of their dependents.

- Every October is the Korean American Friendship Festival, which we have a food booth in.
- Every November is Veteran's Day.
 - In November 1919, President Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day with the following words: "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given

America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations..." An Act (52 Stat. 351; 5 U. S. Code, Sec. 87a) approved May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday—a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as "Armistice Day." Armistice Day was primarily a day set aside to honor veterans of World War I, but in 1954, after World War II had required the greatest mobilization of soldiers, sailors, Marines and airmen in the Nation's history; after American forces had fought aggression in Korea, the 83rd Congress, at the urging of the veterans' service organizations, amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting in its place the word "Veterans." With the approval of this legislation (Public Law 380) on June 1, 1954, November 11th became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

- We hold two large feasts a year for Thanksgiving and Christmas, that the whole family can attend for free. There is also the Super Bowl breakfast.
- Every February is the Hill 180 Ceremony.
 - This ceremony remembers the Medal of Honor earning bayonet charge by Capt Millet and his men on what is now Osan AB.
- Every May is the Armed Forces Day parade.
 - On August 31, 1949, Secretary of Defense Louis Johnson announced the creation of an Armed Forces Day to replace separate Army, Navy and Air Force Days. The single-day celebration stemmed from the unification of the Armed Forces under one department -- the Department of Defense. Each of the military leagues and orders was asked to drop sponsorship of its specific service day in order to celebrate the newly announced Armed Forces Day. The Army, Navy and Air Force leagues adopted the newly formed day. The Marine Corps League declined to drop support for Marine Corps Day but supports Armed Forces Day, also.

This event is sponsored annually by Osan City and is attended by Osan City Mayor, Kyongi-Do Province Governor and US & ROK military leadership. They were accompanied by John Okonski, the 51st Fighter Wing Historian and also a VFW member. The trio laid flowers on the monument.
